ÁRRAN 360°

Árran is the Northern Sámi word to describe the hearth of a lávvu, around which Sámi storytelling has taken place since time immemorial. Árran symbolises the life force of the Sámi people, a place where the relationality between human, and non-human beings is interwoven.

ÁRRAN 360° is official part of the extended program of 'The Sámi Pavilion' at the 59th International Art Exhibition of La Biennale de Venezia.

ÁRRAN 360° is a first-of-its-kind film project that will feature six original 360-degree films created by six leading Sámi filmmakers from across Sápmi.

The films will be presented in a purpose-built giant lávvu and equipped with a 360-degree screen designed to showcase these special films. You will be surrounded by the ambience of sámi soulscapes and through our stories experience Sámi lands and worldviews.

In the middle of Venice's famous lagoon, on the island of San Servolo, we enter a new digital realm when indigenous storytellers forefront the exploration of XR-technologies.

ÁRRAN 360° FILMS - WORLD PREMIERE



ÁRRAN360 is a fusion of Indigenous storytelling and innovative technology. The Lávvu has a strong tradition in the Sámi culture, as it has been both a home and a spiritual space for our people for centuries. The Lávvu was our shelter in the harsh Arctic winters and we constructed it to endure strong winds. Our children were born, our stories told, and our elders passed there. The traditional lávvu has always been mobile, and as our famous poet Aillohaš said: "My home is in my heart, and it migrates with me," Entering our film lávvu you will step into a circular space where the past meets the future.



It's an underground cave party! Young people dance to escape the angst of world destruction, summoning the aid of the forgotten Sámi earth deities Uksáhkká, Juoksáhkká and Sáráhkká.

In Guhte gullá / Here to hear, women of different generations listen to the voices of their foremothers through dance and duodji, traditional Sámi handicrafts. The mother-daughter relationship between Outi Pieski and Birit and Katja Haarla chimes aptly with the theme of their first joint artistic collaboration.







Greeting visitors at the vaporetto station on the island, Ráste is a Sámi noaidi, a pathfinder and guide, that will show you the way to the hearth of the lávvu.



The Daughters of Maadteraahka by Carola Grahn

Passed down from generation to generation in 'joiks' and sagas, is the story of Maadteraahka, the ancestral mother of the Sámi who holds both life and death in her hands. Her three daughters, Saaraahka, Joeksaahka and Oksaahka are powerful goddesses who have protected and cared for the Sámi since the earliest days. Witness these beings in this remarkable augmented reality work that complements the central lávvu in San Servolo.




